


- Be there for the child. Listen when they need to talk and hug them when they need comfort.

# According to estimates, the yearly impact of conventional burial includes the burial of:

- 4.3 million gallons of embalming fluid
- 64,500 tons of steel, 2,700 tons of copper and bronze, and 20 million board feet of hardwood for caskets
- 1.6 million tons of reinforced concrete and 14,000 tons of steel for burial vaults\*
